<u>Parents:</u> Your student will receive a newsletter at each 4-H meeting (Sept., Oct., Nov., Jan., Feb., and April) during the school year. The newsletter will have information about monthly contests, and other available activities including Project Achievement speech competition and 4-H summer camp.

4-H Holiday Card Contest

Design a holiday card for our 4-H holiday card contest! The winning design will be featured on our Athens-Clarke County 4-H holiday card. This card will be sent to the mayor, school board, county commissioners, and other local dignitaries.

- 1. Make your drawing on **white, unlined 8.5 by 5.5 inch paper.** This is one half of regular computer printer paper. The size is very important.
- 2. Put your **NAME, ADDRESS, GRADE**, and **SCHOOL** on the back of the card.
- 3. Include the 4-H symbol, the 4 leaf clover, in your design.
- 4. Submit your card to your teacher before your October club meeting. This is an excellent way to earn points for club of the month!



Here are a few helpful hints to make your holiday card:


Use a universal December holiday theme such as "Happy Holidays" or "Seasons Greetings" rather than focusing on Christmas, Hanukkah or Kwanza. We want everyone to enjoy the card no matter what holiday they celebrate.

Make your card design attractive and colorful and BE CREATIVE!

Radon Poster Contest

Here's a drawing contest designed for students ages 9 to 14. To enter this contest simply design and submit a poster that will help raise awareness about the dangers of radon gas and the importance of testing your home. Radon is a naturally occurring gas that can become trapped in buildings and cause certain health problems. Design a poster that alerts people to the dangers of radon following these simple rules:

- Submit your completed poster design at your October 4-H meeting.
- Use only white paper, size 8.5 by 11 inches
- Artwork must be original—crayon, markers, paints, colored pencils are all acceptable
- Do not use symbols or characters associated with products, organizations, or businesses.
- Poster must have a title on the front.
- Student's name **must not** be on the front of the poster
- Put your name, address, school, age, and grade on the back of poster
- Poster must be about one of the following themes:
 - 1. What is radon?
 - 2. Where does radon come from?
 - 3. How does radon get into our homes?
 - 4. Radon can cause lung cancer
 - 5. Test your home for radon.
