Want to receive a Summer Camp Scholarship?

<u>Fifth and Sixth Grade students</u> who compete at Cloverleaf Project Achievement (CPA) at Clarke Middle School on <u>February 12</u> and at Jackson County Elementary on <u>March 26</u> can apply for a Summer Camp Scholarship to pay for most of the Rock Eagle Camp Registration fee.

Students are encouraged to do their best at the competitions presenting a 3-to-6-minute speech with a visual aid, like a board or poster, but are not required to win. However, parents must complete the Scholarship Application form after the Jackson County DPA if they want their 4-H'er to receive a camp Scholarship for June 27-July 1. (If student is not winner in first choice project at CPA, they can choose an open project for DPA.)

The full price for Summer Camp at Rock Eagle is \$325 but if fifth & sixth grade students participate on both dates listed above and submit an application, they can receive scholarship funds to reduce the price for camp to only \$100! Please sign up with their Teacher at school or e-mail Ms. Conway at ebarber@uga.edu before February 1 if you want to compete at Project Achievement (CPA)!

MilkMake Recipe Contest

The dairy industry is an important part of Georgia agriculture. There are currently 200 dairy farms in Georgia that produced over 206 million gallons of milk last year. Milk and milk products are an important source of calcium in our diets. Let's get creative and see if you can create a recipe for a milk shake or smoothie.

Here are a few simple rules:

- 1. Find or make up a recipe for a milk drink. It must have milk as one of the ingredients.
- 2. Write out the complete recipe. Make sure it has a title, list of ingredients, and a description of how to make your drink. Be sure to put your name on your recipe.
- 3. Make the drink following your directions.
- 4. Have someone taste it and write their comments.
- 5. Turn in your recipe and your taster's comments at your February 4-H meeting.



CPA is a Fun Learning Experience

You've had time to think about the October lesson on how to give a speech. Let's put those skills to work and enter the 4-H Project Achievement competition! Now is the time to check out the project listing and choose a subject in which you are interested. Project Achievement takes place on Saturday, February 12, 2022 at Clarke Middle School from 9:30 AM until NOON. All attendees at this event are required to wear a face mask inside CMS.

To participate in this competition students, present a 3-to-6-minute informative speech about their topic, using visuals such as posters or items to enhance their presentation. *Unfortunately, in this 4-H competition we cannot use PowerPoint or similar computer-generated programs for these presentations.* There are a few exceptions to the speech requirement that were outlined on your project list sheet. Students interested in the Food Labs Projects: Between Meal Snacks or Food Fare category must make an appointment with 4-H staff to learn about the special requirements for those projects. You and a parent will need to meet with 4-H staff before competing in either.

Students compete against other students who are presenting in the same category they have selected. Judges will listen to each presentation and award points in the following manner: appearance, visual aids, delivery, orderly progress, accuracy of information, coverage of subject, knowledge of subject and time limit. As a bonus, winners from the CPA competition in February will earn the opportunity to travel to Jackson County to compete in the District contest (DPA) on March 26.
