POULTRY JUDGING SIGN UP MEETING

4-H members who want to sign up for the 4-H Poultry Judging Team need to attend the first meeting on **Tuesday, February 27th, at 4 PM until 5 PM in the 4-H office**. Please make arrangements to attend this meeting if you are interested.

In Poultry Judging, you will learn how to compare laying hens to determine the best layer, how to grade eggs by candling, how to judge exterior quality and broken-out eggs, how to grade ready to cook birds, and how to identify different cuts of meat. Practice will be held one to three times a week from February 27th until the contest date of **May 1st**. You will get 50 points toward the 4-H Reward Trip by participating in the Poultry Judging contest. This is the last opportunity to compete in a contest to qualify for the Reward Trip.

JUNIOR/SENIOR PROJECT ACHIEVEMENT
