Grady County 4-H is kicking off its Spring Fundraiser. For the next 8 weeks, you will have the opportunity to sell Vidalia Onions to help generate funds for the Grady County 4-H Program as well as to earn scholarship money to help pay your way to 4-H Summer Camp.

Once the camp scholarships are paid, the remaining profits from the onion fundraiser helps pay for Project Achievement, all of our various judging team programs, the "Summer Fun" program, and of course our Annual 4-H Awards Banquet.

The fundraiser will run from March 2nd through April 26th. <u>All money and forms are due to the 4-H Office by Tuesday, April 26th at 5:30 pm.</u> Pick-up will be Tuesday, May 16th, 3:30-6:00pm at the Farmers Market.

Sell Onions to pay your way to Summer Camp: As a way to help you pay your registration fees for summer camp, we will once again allow you to use the profits from your total sales to put towards your registration fee. You must first pay the \$75 registration fee and then you can use the profits from your onion sales to pay the remaining \$325 for Cloverleaf, Junior & Senior Camp.

Getting Started for Next Year:

If you are interested in showing cattle next year, now is the time you need to be locating your steer or heifer.

Cattle producers who raise show steers and heifers are beginning to market those animals for the 2023 - 2024 show season. The upcoming show season for cattle will get started in July '23 and run through the state shows in Feb. '24.

Birthdates of cattle for next year:

It is suggested that steers be born after August 1, 2022.

Heifers must be born after January 1, 2022. You can show purebred or commercial heifers.

Summer Camp Registration is Still Open!

We realize summer is still 3 months away, but you will find information for all age groups included on this page.

Let us tell you to begin with that we will once again allow you to use the profits from your **Vidalia Onion Sales** in March - May to pay your camp registration fee. You will have to pay the non-refundable deposit out of your pocket and then you can use your onion profits to pay the remaining portion of your camp fee. For all of the camps, the deposit is \$75.

When you look at the camp registration deadlines, please keep in mind the sooner you pay your camp deposit the more likely you are to guarantee yourself a spot on the bus. We will continue to promote all 3 camps until they are full for the week we will be attending camp.

Senior Camp @ Rock Eagle 4-4 Center

4-H'ers in grades 9-12 are eligible to attend Sr. Camp. This year, Senior Camp is headed to the **Rock Eagle 4-H Center**. Camp is scheduled for **July 3-7** and will **cost \$400**. Senior 4-H'ers, this is your chance to socialize with other high school age 4-H'ers and not have those pesky cloverleaf or junior age 4-H'ers hanging around.

Who's going to win the tribal shield?

Plans will include 4th of July picnic with FIREWORKS, game room, and fun activities. There will be plenty of time to socialize with your friends from around the state. You will also enjoy the Rock Eagle Variety Show and Pageant.

There is only 1 statewide Senior Camp and registration is available on a first-come, first-serve basis for the entire state. So, if you are interested in attending Senior

Camp, get your registration fee in early.

The camp fee can be broken down into 3 easy payments: February 27th - \$75 non-refundable deposit due, April 7th - \$160, and May 5th final payment of \$165. Mr. Deron will be serving as a leader for Senior Camp. We hope you will decide to join him for this fun and exciting week of camp!

Junior Camp @ Fortson 4-4 Center

This year, camp for 7th & 8th graders will be at **Fortson 4-H Center** the week of **June 19-23**. The **cost of camp is \$400**. This covers all camping activities, lodging, meals, t-shirt, transportation cost and insurance. Camp payment can be broken down into three easy payments. These are as follows: March 6th - \$75 non-refundable deposit, April 7th - \$160 second payment, May 5th - \$165 final payment.

During your week at camp, you will enjoy team building activities on Fortson's famous high & low ropes course, participate in Fortson's Olympics. Off-center activities include a trip to Stone Mountain to see their exciting laser light show and shopping at Stone Mountain Village. On-center activities include swimming, free-time, nature trails, farm animals, sports activities, and enjoy a movie on the large blow-up screen.

It is a week full of activities you will not want to miss. Registration is on a first-come, first-serve basis and our beginning camp quota is 12 4-H'ers. This year, John Sodrel, Grady County 4-H Program Assistant will be chaperoning the group to Camp Fortson.



Cloverleaf Camp @ Georgia 4-H at Camp Jekyll
