Please join us for our 28th Annual Peanut Fundraiser.

Fundraiser Facts:

We sell the re-sealable, 12 oz. cans of plain salted, honey roasted, and butter toffee peanuts from the Georgia Peanut Commission. Sale dates are from October 16th until November 16th.

All money & order forms are due at the 4-H Office no later than 5:30 pm on Thursday, November 16th. You can pick up your peanut order on Thursday, November 16th from 1:00 - 5:30pm at the 4-H Office.

Scholarships Awarded to Top Sellers:

1st place = \$150 2nd place = \$125 3rd place = \$100

Anyone with \$100 or more in sales will receive a long sleeve t-shirt.

Shooting Sports Participants:

For those of you who wish to use the Peanut Fundraiser as an activity for the Archery or Shotgun teams, you must sell at least 18 cans to count as 1 activity. If you sell 3 cases (36 cans) it will count as 2 activities. There are 12 cans per case.



Modified Trap: This program will begin February 1, 2024. 4-H'ers in grades 6th-12th are eligible to participate. You will need to furnish your own gun; shells and skeet are included in the team registration fee.

Skeet, Trap, & Sporting Clays: This is our more advanced shotgun program. 4-H'ers in 6th-12th grades are eligible to participate. Official practices will start February 6, 2024.



HUNTER SAFETY CLASS REGISTRATION

For 6th-12th grade 4-H'ers shooting on the Grady County 4-H Archery, Modified Trap or Skeet, Trap & Sporting Clays Teams, you must complete the Georgia Hunter Safety Course.

After you pass your online Hunter Education Course, log onto your account at GoOutdoorsGeorgia and print your certificate. Check with Ranges at Oakfield in Thomasville for in-person classes.

PEANUT RECIPE CONTEST

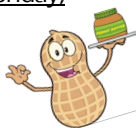
Contest Information: The contest will be held at the 4-H Office on Thursday, **December 13th from 4:30–6:00 pm.**

If you plan on competing, please call the 4-H Office at 377-1312 by Monday, December 11th to register.

Contest Rules:

Cloverleaf (Grades 4-6):

1. Each participant must submit and make a recipe for his/her favorite peanut butter sandwich in the county contest.
2. Any recipe with inedible items will be disqualified.
3. The recipe should list ingredients for 1 sandwich, as well as directions for assembling the sandwich. Recipes can be written or typed.
4. Recipes will be judged on nutrition,



appeal, creativity, recipe presentation, recipe content, and appropriateness for category.

5. Winners will be selected in a county contest as follows: One Overall Winner and winners in the 3 categories of Most Nutritious, Most Unusual, and Most Creative.

Junior Division (7th-8th graders):

1. Each participant must submit and make a recipe for his/her favorite uncooked snack containing a peanut product.
2. The recipe should be for 1 serving and must include a minimum of either 1/4 cup peanuts (any kind: raw, roasted, salted, dry roasted, chopped or ground); or 2 T. peanut butter or other peanut products. Recipes can be written or typed.
3. Recipes will be judged on nutrition, appeal, creativity, recipe presentation,

recipe content and appropriateness for category.

4. Winners will be selected in a county contest as follows: One Overall Winner and winners in the 3 categories of Most Nutritious, Most Unusual, and Most Creative.

Due to the fact that someone has to taste your creations, please follow good sanitary practices when preparing your recipes.

This contest counts as an activity for Cloverleaf 4-H'ers shooting Archery and is considered a State Level activity for Junior 4-H'ers.



MILKMAKE CONTEST

The Grady County 4-H MilkMake Contest is a fun Food & Nutrition Activity for Cloverleaf and Junior 4-H'ers. This means any 4-H'er in grades 4-8 who love milkshakes can participate in the contest.

The contest will be held at the 4-H Office on Thursday, **December 13th from 4:30–6:00 pm.**

What to do:

1. Each participant must submit and make a recipe for a milk-based drink including milkshakes and smoothies for the county contest.
2. The main ingredient should be milk and the recipe should include the amount of ingredients, number of servings and directions for preparing the drink.

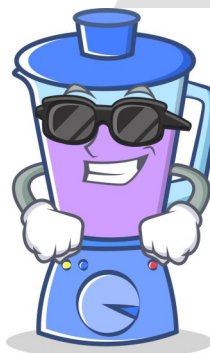


3. Recipes can be written or typed.
