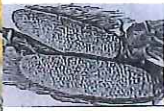

**Golden Bantam- Heirloom.** Ears are very uniform and average 6-7 inches long with 8 rows of yellow kernels. Ears has a tender, sweet flavor and is good for eating fresh, freezing, and canning.

**Country Gentleman- Heirloom.** Characterized by its tightly packed, but uneven rows of kernels. Corn ears reach 7-8 inches long and produce sweet white kernels.

**Georgia Rattlesnake Watermelon- Heirloom.** Georgia Rattlesnake is said to have been developed in the 1830s. Averages 25-50 pounds.



**Tendersweet Orange Watermelon- Heirloom.** Orange, crisp, sweet, watermelon that is not only colorful, but also intensely tasty. 30 lb. fruit.



**Rainbow Chard- Heirloom** chard is a leafy vegetable that makes a good alternative to spinach. Amazing colors in shades of red, purple, pink, orange, yellow and white. Stalks can be eaten like celery.



**Musclum Mix Greens**— Super salad greens like served in restaurants. Clip with scissors and it regrows!



**Cosmic Purple Carrot-** Purple on the outside and bright orange on the inside these carrots are a real show stopper. This is a sweet carrot that is tasty and coreless.



**Royal Burgundy Bush Bean-** Highly flavorful, purple podded snap bean that turns green when it is cooked. Stringless



**Kentucky Wonder Bean- Heirloom.** Classic pole bean that appeared sometime in the 1850s Heavy producer; its 7-10" pods are stringless and tender when young, and rich in flavor.



**Clemson Spineless Okra- Heirloom.** Clemson Spineless 80 has longer pods, a more open form, and LESS prickly spines. Produces earlier than many okra varieties and can have some real heavy yields.



**Burgundy Okra-** You can grow this okra alone for the hibiscus-like flowers not to mention the tasty purple pods are 5-8". The bushy okra grows 3-4' tall. These pods don't turn woody as quickly as other varieties.



**Tendergreen Burpless Cucumber-** Tendergreen Burpless cucumber is sweet, tender, non-bitter and acid free.



**Boston Pickling Cucumber-** Very old (first documented in 1877) reliable pickling cucumber that was "improved" in the 1950s giving it resistance to cucumber mosaic virus and cucumber scale. Heavy yields of small 6" cucumbers



**Black Beauty Zucchini-** Black Beauty squash was introduced 1957. Dark-green turning to nearly black when fully mature.



**Golden Zucchini**— Compact bush type plant that is perfect for those with limited space in their gardens. It is a prolific producer of dazzling gold zucchinis



**Yellow Crookneck Squash**— Bush type plant produces copious yields of buttery-yellow squash with narrow curved neck.
