4-H Update:

Georgia 4-H reached the \$100,000 mark in donations to the Ronald McDonald Houses of Georgia. This year GA 4-H raised **\$5,619.16** to bring the 16 year total to **\$103,407.40**. Over 8,500 pounds of pop tabs were collected and recycled this year, which makes the total for our state around 168,529 pounds of pop tabs in the last 16 years.
