Our New Home, the Robert Train Building, Wins Preservation Award

On May 4, 2022, the Robert Train Building was awarded a 2022 Preservation Award by the Historic Macon Foundation (HMF). The event was held at Grant's Lounge in downtown Macon, where a festive crowd gathered in anticipation of the announcement of winners. The evening award ceremony was part of the foundation's annual meeting held during National Preservation Month.

Nine awards were presented to honor those who have been instrumental in preservation and restoration achievements in Macon. The Robert Train Building, located at 715 Oglethorpe Street, was recognized in the commercial category. Renovations were completed on

the 1920 structure in late February 2022, and the building is now the home of the Macon-Bibb County UGA Cooperative Extension.

Presenting the award were members of the HMF board, Mr. Larry Brumley, current Chairman; Ms. Gerri McCord, past Chairman, along with Ethiel Garlington, Executive Director. The team accepting the award included members of Extension staff, Dunwody Beeland Architects, Piedmont Construction, and Bibb County leadership. New Home, Same Solid Programming!

We are settled into our new space and off to a great start! Our home, the Robert Train building, has a rich history, including being the epicenter of activity during Macon's mill days. Local residents gathered here to do a variety of recreational activities.

We anticipate adding to the history of the Train building by utilizing the teaching kitchen to offer educational health and wellness classes for the Macon-Bibb County community. We plan to do this through a variety of programs offered under the umbrella of Family and Consumer Sciences (FACS). Here is a snapshot of programming offerings:

- Health and Wellness workshops/classes are offered to educate participants on reducing fat, sugar, and sodium to therefore reduce the risks for certain chronic diseases, such as cancer, high blood pressure, and diabetes. Because what and how much you eat is so important, the workshops/classes offer practical solutions to eat like a foodie and also meet your health goals. The classes generally offer a food demonstration and recipes.
- The Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP) is an 8-session class designed to educate participants on making SMART food choices and stretching the family's food dollars. Each lesson has a tasty recipe that is demonstrated and made in class.
- ServSafe food safety classes are offered to reduce the instance of foodborne illness in our community. Manager Certification classes are offered to assist local food managers in obtaining state-required certification in food safety. Food Handler classes are offered to organizations that handle food on a regular basis and foodservice workers seeking to improve employment options. Some participants have included churches, food pantries, and food delivery providers.
- Estate Planning educational workshops and classes are offered to protect assets. Long-term planning is essential for everyone; however, most people need additional education surrounding estate planning. FACS provides

educational opportunities to learn the language of estate planning, what happens in the absence of estate planning, and how the documents work to protect assets for future generations.

We have been off and running with the teaching kitchen, specifically hosting Seniors from the Elaine Lucas Senior Center and 4-H summer cooking activities. EFNEP regularly utilizes the kitchen to prepare for classes at local schools and nonprofit organizations. Be on the lookout for future classes and workshops.

The Macon-Bibb Extension Agriculture and Natural Resources program has long dreamt of having a green space.
