"Show & Tell" for 5th and 6th grade
4-H'ers. You get to talk about
ANYTHING that you are interested in
and share your interests with others.

Step 1: Pick a Project

Step 2: Create your 4-H Presentation. A completed project includes a SPEECH & VISUALS (Google Slides, Posters, or Tri-fold display)

Step 3: Present your project presentation at Cloverleaf Project Achievement on March 10th (5:00-7:30pm @ JPB). All participants are also eligible to compete at the larger OPTIONAL District Contest in Candler County on March 22nd.

NOTE: All contest participants will get the opportunity to sign up for 4-H Summer Camp EARLY!!!

Select a project category, narrow down to a specific topic, then research your topic (online search, library resources, magazines, talking to experts, etc.). Make sure that all of your sources are reliable.

4-H Project Needs Speech + Visual Aids Speech should be 3-5 minutes long!

3 parts to a 4-H Speech: Introduction, Body, Closing:

Introduction: hook your audience, introduce yourself, tell what your topic is

Body: 3 big points that you will share facts about, describe things logically

Closing: summarize 3 big points, refer back to your hook, and leave the audience wanting to learn more!

Design your Slides/Posters

Your Visuals may be in the form of Google Slides, PowerPoint Slides, Poster Boards, or a Tri-Board display. Make sure your key points are shared on your visuals. If you need help making your visual aids, please call the 4-H Office! We can help with Slides, PPT, and posters for free!

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
