How is the BB Team program structured?

We spend the first couple of weeks working on rules, **safety**, proper form, and technique. Once we start shooting, team members will use four different Olympic-style shooting positions: standing, prone, sitting and kneeling. While in each position, shooters will fire 10 shots for a score in each position. Targets are 5 meters (approx. 16 feet) away. The highest possible score for each position is 100, therefore, the total possible shooting score is 400. Although the black aiming circle of each target is about $\frac{3}{4}$ " in diameter, the bullseye is only the diameter of a BB.



At each practice, 4-H'ers will also learn and test over gun safety rules. This not only teaches proper firearm safety but will also help them prepare for the Safety Exam at the State Match.

BB Team members will be encouraged to participate in several "fun shoots" this spring along with the District Qualifier Match (late March in Lyons) and the State Match on April 25 at Rock Eagle (if they qualify at district).

Georgia 4-H requires all Project S.A.F.E. teams to be coordinated by certified adult volunteer coaches. These coaches go through a 4-H training program and must complete background check and risk management trainings. Certified coaches coordinate and plan practices, but parent/guardian involvement is crucial to the success of a 4-H BB program.

What is the commitment level?

BB Team Members are expected to attend weekly organized practices from November-April and practice at home. To be successful, shooters must be committed. They must understand the rules, learn correct shooting form and practice correct shooting fundamentals and techniques. This requires discipline to attend practices. We also ask that BB team members participate in team fundraising efforts and community service projects.

Parents/guardians are also expected to commit to the 4-H BB Team. **Parents/guardians are expected to accompany BB team members to all practices and matches.** They are expected to participate by coaching, scoring targets, conducting study and testing sessions and supervising gun maintenance. These skills will be taught by certified coaches. Parents/guardians are expected to sit beside their 4-H'er during practice and monitor their safety for the duration of practice and matches.

What is the registration cost?

BB Team registration costs **\$150** for the year. This can be paid in installments with the first \$75 due by November 7, 2025 and the remaining \$75 due by March 1, 2026. This registration fee covers practice ammunition, tournament fees, practice materials, coaches training costs and team jersey.

What equipment is needed?

BB Team Members need a **Daisy 499B Competition gun**. These can be purchased directly through Daisy or from past team members. External modifications can be made to the guns and will be coordinated by the Project S.A.F.E. Coordinator. Team members will need a **HARD** gun case and may want to have a basic set of binoculars. 4-H'ers and Parents need **eye protection** for each practice. All other equipment will be provided.

When and where are practices?

Practices will begin in November and will be held on a **weekly basis on Tuesdays from 6:00-7:30 pm at the Old MMS Weight Room** (on South Register Street near the Rec. Dept.). A full practice schedule will be provided.

What if my child has never shot a gun?

Most team members have little to no experience when they start the program. 4-H'ers will learn firearm safety, self-confidence, self-esteem, self-discipline, improved eye-hand coordination and an increased ability to focus on a specific task. Furthermore, shooting is a life-long sport they can enjoy.

2025-2026 Candler County 4-H Project S.A.F.E. BB Participants and Parent Contract

In order for the Project S.A.F.E. to be both rewarding and safe experience, 4-H'ers must abide by the Rules and Regulations set forth by the Club. They are as follows:

KEEP THIS COPY

1. **ATTENDANCE AT PRACTICE IS IMPORTANT FOR TEAM MEMBERS.** Absences must be excused by the Project S.A.F.E. coordinator prior to a scheduled practice. Practice times will be communicated, and 4-H'ers are expected to arrive at practice on time. However, **if a 4-H'er or certified coach is sick they should not come to practice.** Text the GroupMe or one of the coaches if you are going to miss practice. Team placement at tournaments will be influenced by attendance at practices. **Team members must attend the 2 practices immediately prior to a tournament in order to participate in that tournament.**
2. **All absences – whether excused or unexcused can be made up at future practices.** Make-up practices will be scheduled as needed.
3. **Members will be responsible for cleaning up their shooting area after each practice.**
4. Members must follow the directions and safety standards set by the coaches, the Georgia 4-H Code of Conduct and all range guidelines and safety procedures. **Failure to follow instructions, horseplay and other unsafe behavior can result in suspension from the team.** Horseplay and other unsafe behavior will result in suspension from the team.
5. Teams will be designated by the coaches based on **attendance and performance at practices.** Teams must qualify at the district contest in order to participate in the state match.
6. **Registration Costs for 2025-2026 4-H BB Team is \$150.** This can be paid in installments with the first \$75 due by November 7, 2025 and the remaining \$75 due by March 1, 2026. This registration fee covers ammunition for practices, invitational, district and state tournament fees, practice materials, coaches training costs and team jersey.
 - a. Team members will be expected to participate in Project S.A.F.E. fundraisers and/or solicit donations to the Project S.A.F.E. program and participate in team community service projects.
 - b. In the event that a 4-H'er decides to quit or is suspended from the Shooting Sports Club, membership dues will not be refunded. This is necessary since supplies will be purchased in advance for each 4-H'er.
7. 4-H'ers are expected to provide their own BB gun for the 4-H team. The required gun for the team is a Daisy 499B. Some former team members may have guns available for sale at a reduced price.
8. In all circumstances, 4-H'ers, parents and coaches are responsible for their actions and upholding the standards of the Georgia 4-H Project S.A.F.E. Program. All of us are expected to behave in a manner suitable for the promotion of a 4-H youth development program, high ideals and the promotion of shooting sports as a safe and respectable recreation activity. Cooperation, self-control, self-discipline and high standards of sportsmanship are expected at all times.
9. Without proper safety practices and training the sporting equipment involved can lead to physical danger. With respect to this potential danger; those volunteers that are coaching and providing the instructional training will deem it necessary to instruct and discipline from time to time for the best interests of all involved. The foremost concern is safety with skill attainment and enjoyment second.
10. All 4-H'ers, coaches, scorekeepers/referees, and range safety officers will wear **eye protection** at all times while on the firing line.
11. **Closed toe shoes** that are secured to the feet by use of a heel strap or formed heel must be worn at all times while on the range. Boots, high top tennis shoe, and any other shoe that provides ankle support are not allowed. Flip flops, sandals and crocs are not allowed. Shoes must be worn at the firing line.
12. 4-H'ers are not allowed to transport firearms and ammunition to and from practices or matches without being accompanied by an adult. Guns should be placed in the designated area for the duration of practice and

competitions. The 4-H'er is allowed to transfer their BB gun, with coach's approval, from the designated gun storage area to the firing line and back to the designated area.

13. At no time may a gun muzzle be rested on the body part or a toe pad in 4-H competition. In addition, no body part may be rested on the muzzle of the firearm.
14. The Range Officer will be in charge at all times during the match. Failure to heed the Range Officer's instructions immediately will be grounds for ejection from the match and removal from the range.
15. In the event of a misfire, the 4-H'er cannot move either hand from the firearm, must maintain muzzle control down range while keeping their finger on the trigger. The 4-H'er must follow the instruction of the referee. Only a referee can inspect the firearm to determine and declare an ammunition or gun malfunction or shooter error.
16. Safety is the number one consideration in the 4-H SAFE Program. The Range Officer or any safety officer may eject any 4-H'ers, coach or spectator for unsafe actions or behavior at any time during the match with no warning or appeal upon the event coordinators approval.
17. Communication is very important to the success of this program. Parents should check email and "GroupMe" communications regularly. To join the "GroupMe" scan the QR code below:



18. Parents/guardians are a vital part of the 4-H BB program and are expected to adhere to these general policies:
 - a. Parents/guardians are expected to accompany BB team members to all practices and matches.
 - b. Parents/guardians are expected to participate by coaching, scoring targets, conducting study and testing sessions and supervising gun maintenance. Parents/guardians will be taught these skills.
 - c. Parents/guardians are expected to sit beside their 4-H'er during practice and monitor their safety for the duration of practice and matches.
 - d. Parents/guardians are only allowed to coach their own child(ren).
 - e. Parents/guardians are expected to provide transportation to/from all matches and make any necessary lodging arrangements.

As a member of the Candler County Project S.A.F.E. BB Club, I have read and understand the above rules and regulations and agree to abide by them. I have also read and understand the Georgia 4-H Code of Conduct, and the Project S.A.F.E. Range Guidelines and Safety Procedures. GEORGIA 4-H CODE OF CONDUCT

BEHAVIOR STANDARDS:

The Georgia 4-H Code of Conduct is valid for one 4-H Program Year and applies to all activities coordinated through Georgia 4-H.

- 4-H'ers are expected to attend all sessions as part of a planned program exhibiting positive character and behavior including (but not limited to) trustworthiness, responsibility, respectfulness, caring, citizenship and fairness.
- 4-H'ers are expected to be responsive to the reasonable requests of leaders and respectful of the needs for their personal safety and the safety of others.
- 4-H'ers should dress appropriately, use appropriate language, and respect the rights of others.
- 4-H'ers may not behave recklessly or in a manner which prohibits others from participating in the program in the manner intended.
- 4-H'ers may have access to technology at UGA/CES offices and facilities. Technology use is for educational purposes. 4-H'ers may not access inappropriate websites or materials.
- 4-H'ers are expected to do their own work on projects including but not limited to: portfolios, speeches, competitive events, and show animals. 4-H'ers may only receive assistance whether from others or from tools like generative AI with approval from the appropriate 4-H staff. 4-H'ers will properly cite source materials when appropriate, avoid plagiarism, and uphold academic integrity.
- 4-H'ers are expected to maintain a fair and respectful environment. In accordance with UGA's policies, Georgia 4-H prohibits harassment of or discrimination against any person on the basis of an individual's age, color, disability, genetic information, national origin, race, religion, sex, or veteran status ("protected status"). Every member of Georgia 4-H is expected to uphold this policy as a matter of mutual respect and fundamental fairness in human relations.
- Realizing these guidelines are not "all inclusive" the University of Georgia Extension staff and volunteers reserve the right to make adjustments to these policies.

CONSEQUENCES OF MISBEHAVIOR

4-H'ers and adults who observe a breach in the Code of Conduct must report the misbehavior to the appropriate leader. The leader will complete an incident report as necessary and determine the next steps regarding the incident.

If 4-H'ers are found participating in actions listed below, during 4-H events, law enforcement or other legal authorities may be notified and may lead the review and consequences related to the incident. In these incidents, 4-H'ers may be removed from the event and suspended or expelled from future 4-H participation. These behaviors may include, but are not restricted to:

4-H'ers who participate in these actions outside of the program may also be removed, suspended, or expelled from future 4-H participation. In addition to the above, behaviors that represent a threat to the health or safety of 4-H'ers or others could warrant consideration under this Code of Conduct regardless of whether the behavior occurs during 4-H participation.

If the 4-H'er is found participating in the actions listed below, 4-H leaders may be notified and may lead the review and consequences related to the behavior.

4-H'ers misbehaving may be asked questions and may have the opportunity to explain their actions to leaders in charge of the activity. The person coordinating the event may also convene a review board for the purpose of determining what has occurred and what disciplinary action should be taken. A review board will consist of individuals representing Extension faculty or staff, volunteers, and/or 4-H members. In some cases, incidents are deemed serious and may be referred to law enforcement or other legal authorities as noted above. If the 4-H'er receives consequences from the leader or through the

review process, his/her parents/guardians may be notified; the 4-H'er may be removed from the 4-H event and sent home at the parents' expense and may be suspended from participation in future 4-H events. If a 4-H'er wishes to appeal the decision of the review board, the 4-H'er must appeal in writing through the County Extension office. Appeals must be filed within 10 days of notification of the disciplinary action. The appeal is sent to the Program Development Coordinator of the 4-H member and the State 4-H Leader for ruling by the State 4-H Leader. Following any disciplinary review, written notification will be provided to the appropriate parties including but not limited to the 4-H'er, his/her parent/guardian and his/her county Extension faculty member.

Additional violations of the 4-H Code of Conduct include, but are not limited to:

- Breaking curfew or disturbing the peace
- Unexcused absences from the activities or premises of an event
- Unauthorized use of vehicles during the event
- Reckless or inappropriate behavior
- Use of foul or offensive language
- Possession or use of alcohol or tobacco
- Possession or use of e-cigarettes or other vaping devices
- Remaining in the presence of those who are breaking the 4-H Code of Conduct
- Theft, misuse or abuse of public or personal property
- Possession of fireworks
- Distribution, misuse, or abuse of over-the-counter, homeopathic, including supplements and vitamins, or prescription medications
