Want to receive a Summer Camp Scholarship?

Fifth and Sixth Grade Students who compete at Cloverleaf Project Achievement at Athens-Clarke County 4-H Extension Facility on February 10 and in Jackson County March 23 can apply for a summer camp scholarship to pay for most of the Rock Eagle registration fee. Students are encouraged to do their best at the competitions but are not required to win. However, parents must complete the Scholarship Application form after the Jackson County DPA if they want their 4-H'er to receive camp scholarship from July 8-12.



Seventh and Eighth Grade Students who submit a portfolio by December 15 and compete at Junior Project Achievement held at Rock Eagle on Friday-Sunday, March 1-3 can apply for a Summer Camp Scholarship to pay for most of Camp Burton on Tybee Island Registration fee for June 17-21. Students are encouraged to do their best at the competition but are not required to win and it is free to compete at Rock Eagle for the March Weekend.

Cloverleaf Project Achievement

Are you working on your speech for Project Achievement? Now is the time to get started! Select from one of 63 categories and prepare a short 3-6 minute informative speech for the competition. Don't forget visuals — something that your audience can see that helps them understand your subject. Practice so that you can do your very best, and come to the competition.

Project Achievement will take place on Saturday February 10 at the Athens Clarke County 4-H Extension Facility from 9:30 a.m. until Noon. Winners will be announced during the closing assembly, and students who win their category will go to the district competition on Saturday March 23 in Jackson County.

Last Call on Project Achievement!!

7th and 8th Grade First Draft Portfolios are Due December 22

March 1, 2024— It seems like such a long time from now. There's plenty of time to work on a project and get it ready for District Project Achievement but not nearly as much time for the portfolio. Remember the portfolio? It's your ticket to Project Achievement at Rock Eagle in March. The due dates for portfolios is December 25, so lets get bus on that portfolio.

Here are a few simple steps:

1. Refer to our 4-h website for information on how to prepare your portfolio:

2. Select your project area from the category list. You do not need to know the exact subject for your March presentation, but you must decide on which project you wish to compete. Note: If you choose a food lab (cooking) project you are REQUIRED to attend a workshop at the 4-H office which will provide instruction and guidelines for your project.

3. Assemble some notes for your activities from the past year. Organize your activities by the portfolio headings: main project work, main project sharing and helping, leadership, citizenship, other 4-H activities. And all other activities. Don't forget things— brainstorm with someone about your activities and events for the year. Use your calendar or agenda book to remind yourself of the things in which you participated. Refer to handouts or contact the 4-H office if you need the headings explained to you again.

4. Type your information using the described format. Try to be as descriptive of your activities as you can be. Remember the person reading and scoring your portfolio does not know you and will never see you. Use your words to make a picture of you and your activities for this judge.

5. The text of your portfolio must be contained on two type written pages remember no clip art or pictures on the text pages. If your text is more than two pages, adjust font size and / or margins and spacing to make it fit in the required area or edit the information that you have included. Print in black ink.

6. supporting material— get out and get some photos made of you doing the things that you have listed in your portfolio. Juniors need one picture page.

7. If you want to go to Project Achievement and need some help with your portfolio, call the 4-H office and arrange a time to meet with someone who will help you.
