Annual 4-H Holiday Card Contest

Design a holiday card for our 4-H Holiday card contest. The winning design will be featured on ur Athens Clarke County4-H card. This card will be sent to the mayor commissioner, the school board and other supporters of 4-H. To enter your own card, just follow there simple IMPORTANT rules:

- 1. Make your drawing on white, unlined paper.
- 2. The size of the paper must be 8.5 x 5.5 inches. This is one half of regular computer printer paper.
- 3. Put your NAME, ADDRESS, GRADE, and SCHOOL on the back of the card.
- 4. Use a universal December holiday theme rather than depicting one specific holiday, and don't forget to include the 4-H symbol.
- 5. Submit your card at your October 4-H meeting.


