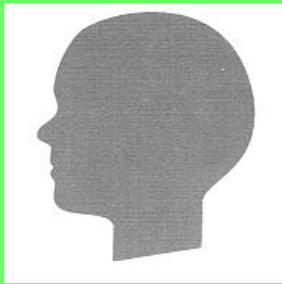

What can I do in 4-H?

- 4-H school programs led by Officers:
 - President: Organizes all officers
 - Vice President: Prepares Volunteers for monthly presentation about previous meeting topic
 - Secretary: Newsletters & Reads monthly notes
 - Reporter: Friends Books & Reads poem or quote from packet or your own selection
- Competitions and contests
- Project Achievement
- Helping others
- Summer activities





4-H Holiday Card Contest
