
Steps for a Great Presentation


















Building Your Speech







- <u>Body</u> Give your audience the facts about your topic and arrange in a logical order. You should have at least three main ideas/facts that you develop into paragraphs.
- <u>Conclusion</u> Summarize your main points, refer back to the opening question or statement.


