# Pearl Millet Wins Approval from Honey Bees and Other Pollinators

Pearl millet, an annual grass used for grain and forage, can be a good food source for honey bees and hover flies, according to a recent study.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Agricultural Research Service (ARS) and University of Georgia College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences researchers studied the impact of pearl millet as a source of insect food by surveying insects collecting and consuming the sucrose-rich pollen of this crop. Researchers planted Tift Long-Headed Bulk, a type of pearl millet known for its long candlestick-like heads, at a research farm in Tifton, Georgia, during the past summer.

According to the survey results, the most common insects observed feeding on Tift Long-Headed Bulk pearl millet were honey bees followed by lined earwigs and maize calligrapher hover flies. Other pollinators such as two-spotted longhorn bees, common eastern bumble bees, American bumble bees, sweat bees, and two other species of hover flies also feasted on the crop.

"What makes the study and the results fascinating is that wind-pollinated

grasses, like pearl millet, are rarely promoted as a food source of pollinators in comparison to nectar-rich plants," said Karen Harris-Shultz, a research geneticist at the ARS Crop Genetics and Breeding Research Unit on the UGA Tifton campus. "Our research shows that pollinators are utilizing grass pollen."

Harris-Shultz added that the study was also the first time that lined earwigs, banded cucumber beetles, two-spotted longhorn bees, and American bumble bees were observed collecting or consuming pollen from the pearl millet crop. ARS researchers in Tifton previously studied pearl millet as a food source for pollinators in 1965, but that study has not been revisited since, according to Harris-Shultz.

Harris-Shultz, CAES Department of Entomology postdoctoral researcher Scott Clem and the rest of the research team focused on bees and other pollinators of grasses, especially centipede grass and sorghum. The researchers took an interest in pearl millet because of its ability to thrive in areas characterized by drought, low soil fertility and high temperatures.

These traits make pearl millet, which is grown primarily in the Southeastern U.S., a low-input crop with great benefits for pollinators and farmers looking for a good field border plant.

"Contrary to popular belief that grasses have no value to bees and other pollinators, this and our previous studies showed that these grasses can be good food sources for insects and may help combat decline in pollinator populations," said Harris-Shultz.

"In addition to being pollinators, several of these insects, such as the hover flies and lined earwigs, are important biological control agents that assist in sustainable pest management."

The recent study and its findings were published in the Journal of Ento-mological Science.



# Now Presenting: The University of Georgia Trial Garden Classic City Award Winners for 2024!

This award is reserved for the plants with the highest flowering, foliage, uniformity, and resistance ratings for the entire season. Many plants are spectacular for a given time, but the Classic City Winners represent the best overall. Athens, Georgia, is the home of the University of Georgia and is known as the "Classic City" as an homage to the Classical city of Athens, Greece. Congratulations to the Classic City Winners for an outstanding performance!

The University of Georgia Trial Garden experienced a mild spring, a hot summer, and minimal rainfall. Plants had perfect growing conditions throughout June and into July. The only significant rainy period lasted about one week in July. Our campus and garden did not suffer any major damage, but we are heartbroken for those in our Southeastern community during the unprecedented flooding from Hurricane Helene.

Our Trial Garden grew this year, with 490 trials, including 296 In-Ground, 112 Containers, 84 Hanging Baskets, and 50 All-American Selections Ornamental In-Ground Seed trials. This year, we saw many entries for Interspecific Impatiens, Geraniums, Cuphea, and Combos.

#### Vining Mandevilla Agate XXL 'Rose Pink' Ball FloraPlant

The name says it all: this Mandevilla has gigantic flowers and an affinity for climbing. Perfect for a tall trellis or arbor, this annual vine made a statement at the entrance to our garden. Plants were trellised in a concrete planter and watered regularly.
