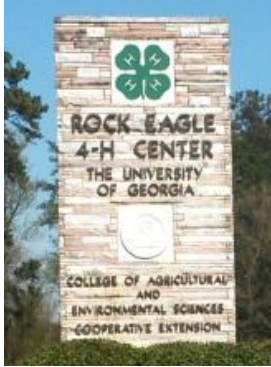

Project Achievement - Part 2

Writing the Speech & Visual Aids

Parts of the Speech

Introduction - will get your audience interested in your speech. Some ways that you can make your speech interesting include ¹starting with a fun or shocking fact related to your topic, ²having your audience imagine how they felt during a certain situation, or ³starting with a question that you will answer with your presentation.

Body - 3 subtopics about your main topic

Conclusion - will help your audience remember your presentation. You will summarize what you have already said. Consider ending with a ¹call to action that asks your audience to take a stand about an issue that you discussed, a ²challenge question that asks your audience what they might do differently now that they have heard your presentation, or ³humor related to your topic.
