


MEET JAMILLE

FALL PLANTING

Are you planning on starting a fall garden? Now is the time to start preparing for it! Getting your soil tested is a great way to make sure your garden is successful. Soil tests provide you with information on the nutrients already in your soil and provide suggestions on how to improve it based on what you are wanting to grow. If you are going to have crop specific beds, you can test each bed individually for the best results. Basic soil tests are \$10 per sample. Results can take up to three weeks, so the earlier you turn in your samples, the better. Call or email to set up an appointment.



JORO SPIDERS IN GA

Joro spiders arrived stateside in 2013, but have been spreading since. While they may be considered an invasive species, they do not seem to be causing any issues within native species' food webs. Joros are not a threat so there is no need to try and actively get rid of them. Enjoy their color and an extra hand at reducing the mosquito population!


