Holes in your home landscape? Here's how to select new plants

Residents of Georgia and other parts of the Southeast inevitably arrive at the same observation: Cold temperatures this past December and weather conditions in subsequent months wreaked havoc on home landscapes. Now that the weather has warmed up, many Georgians have found that where their yards once had healthy and full plantings, there are now holes and scraps of plants.

Instead of replacing like with like, consider something newmaybe a container garden, some specimen plants, or even renovate your current beds.

Once you have an idea of what kind of plant or plants you're looking for and how they will be used in the landscape, gather some basic information about your site. Know how much sun and shade is present throughout the day. For sites that start sunny and become shady (or vice versa), have a good idea of the number of hours of sun and shade. Check your soil to see whether it drains well or tends to be damp. Estimate how much space you have for the plants to fill, including height and width. Make note of any windows or views that you should avoid blocking.

Is one or more of your trees suddenly growing toothpicks out of the trunk?

That is a sure sign of Ambrosia Beetles. Unfortunately, there isn't really a way to treat them once they've gotten into the tree. Depending on the severity of the attack, the tree may survive. If it is a heavy infestation, though, your best bet is to actually remove the tree and try and protect the surrounding trees.

Symptoms of an active infestation include "toothpicks" or strings of sawdust pushed out of tiny pinholes bored in the bark (Figure 1b). Trees severely infested with granulate ambrosia beetle may show symptoms of stunting, delayed leaf emergence in spring, and premature defoliation. The toothpicks are delicate and can easily break apart and dissolve with rain or wind. They infest both young and old trees and these damage symptoms can be seen.

Once adults of granulate ambrosia beetle bore through the bark, there are limited control options to mitigate the problem. Beetles protected in the heartwood of the tree are less likely to be exposed to insecticides. The beetles do not consume the wood, which further minimizes their insecticide exposure, even if using systemic products containing neonicotinoid or diamide insecticides.

Pyrethroid insecticides such as permethrin or bifenthrin can be used as preventative sprays to repel invading females and as a rescue treatment if applied quickly after the attack is initiated. Thus, the insecticide application timing becomes critically important for management.





Tips on asking for advice from your Extension Service

<u>Take pictures</u> – clear pictures of the whole plant, the affected leaves (top and bottom), stems, fruit, and of any bugs or eggs you see

Have information ready - When was it planted? How long has the problem been present? Have you tried any kind of treatment already? Are other plants having the same issues?

Bring in a sample - We are happy to try and diagnose problems in our office (Free). However, for some problems, samples are sent to the UGA Plant Pathology Lab (\$14)

Samples should be in an enclosed bag or container and include damaged plant parts and any insects that were on it




