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SHOTGUN PARTICIPANTS

f you are interested in participating in the '22 Shooting Sports Program, pay close attention to the following reminders.

General Requirements: First of all, whether you want to compete on the Archery, Modified Trap or Skeet, Trap & Sporting Clays team, you must complete two other 4-H activities prior to February 1, 2022. Call the 4-H Office for a list of activities that qualify.

Second, all 7th-12th grade archery & shotgun participants must complete a Hunters Safety Course prior to shooting. If you need to take the course, go to www.georgiawildlife.com to see your

options for taking the course.

Archery: Our '22 archery program has already begun with our Indoor Program. If you are interested in shooting on our archery team, make plans to join our Outdoor Program which starts Feb. 6th.

Modified Trap: This program will begin in early February '22. 4-H'ers in grades 7th-12th are eligible to participate. You will need to furnish your own gun; shells and skeet are included in the team registration fee.

Skeet, Trap, & Sporting Clays: This is our more advanced shotgun program.

4-H'ers in the 7th-12th grades are eligible to participate. Official practices will start in February '22 and will be held at Gray Branch Sporting Clays.

HUNTER SAFETY CLASS REGISTRATION

ne of the requirements for 7th-12th grade 4-H'ers shooting on the Grady County 4-H Archery, Modified Trap or Skeet, Trap & Sporting Clays Teams is that you must complete the Georgia Hunter Safety Course.

Taking a Hunters Education Class in Georgia has been made easier than ever before. The course is offered three different ways. First, you can access the hunter education course online at www.georgiawildlife.com. Second, you can use a hunter education CD-ROM or

finally, you can take a traditional classroom course.

After you pass your online Hunter Education Course, log onto your account at GoOutdoorsGeorgia and print your certificate. If you choose the CD-ROM route, you will need to complete the Customer Information Form and email or mail it in with a copy of your course completion certificate.

If you plan on shooting in 2022 and have not taken the Hunters Education Course, get signed up today to take the

course either online or in person. After taking a quick look at the website, there are only a few in-person classes scheduled for the surrounding area. So, don't hesitate to sign up for a class before they fill up.

'22 LIVESTOCK JUDGING TEAM

alling all livestock enthusiast, the **2022 Livestock Judging Program** is about to get underway.

Our organizational meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, December 8th. The practice will start at 4:00 pm at the 4-H Office and run to 6:00 pm. This meeting is for new, as well as, previous team members.

We will be preparing for the State Contest in Covington on Saturday, March 19th.

For any newcomers, you will learn to evaluate hogs, cattle, sheep, and goats. You will learn to interpret performance data, as well as, learn how to give oral reasons that backup your placing decision.

Practices will be held at the office, as well as, live animal practices will be held at several local livestock producers farms. If you show hogs, cattle, goats, or lambs, this program provides you with an opportunity to learn more about livestock selection & evaluation.

National Trips: Senior Team members are competing for one of two national trips. The 2nd place team goes to the American Royal in Kansas City, KS and the winning team travels to the National Contest in Louisville, KY.

PEANUT RECIPE CONTEST

Contest Information: The contest will be held at the 4-H Office on Wednesday, December 1st from 4:30—6:00 pm.

If you plan on competing, please call the 4-H Office at 377-1312 by Monday, November 23rd to register.

Contest Rules:

Cloverleaf (Grades 4-6):

- Each participant must submit and make a recipe for his/her favorite peanut butter sandwich in the county contest.
- 2. Any recipe with inedible items will be disqualified.
- 3. The recipe should list ingredients for 1 sandwich, as well as directions for assembling the sandwich. Recipes can be written or typed.
- 4. Recipes will be judged on nutrition,

- appeal, creativity, recipe presentation, recipe content, and appropriateness for category.
- Winners will be selected in a county contest as follows: One Overall Winner and winners in the 3 categories of Most Nutritious, Most Unusual, and Most Creative.

Junior Division (7th-8th graders):

- Each participant must submit and make a recipe for his/her favorite uncooked snack containing a peanut product.
- 2. The recipe should be for 1 serving and must include a minimum of either 1/4 cup peanuts (any kind: raw, roasted, salted, dry roasted, chopped or ground); or 2 T. peanut butter or other peanut products. Recipes can be written or typed.
- 3. Recipes will be judged on nutrition, appeal, creativity, recipe presentation,

- recipe content and appropriateness for category.
- Winners will be selected in a county contest as follows: One Overall Winner and winners in the 3 categories of Most Nutritious, Most Unusual, and Most Creative.

Due to the fact that someone has to taste your creations, please follow good sanitary practices when preparing your recipes.

This contest counts as an activity for Cloverleaf 4-H'ers shooting Archery and is considered a State Level activity for Junior 4-H'ers.




MILKMAKE CONTEST
