## **ARCHERY & SHOTGUN PARTICIPANTS**

f you are interested in participating in the '22 Shooting Sports Program, pay close attention to the following reminders.

General Requirements: First of all, whether you want to compete on the Archery,

Modified Trap or Skeet, Trap & Sporting Clays team, you must complete two other 4-H activities prior to February 1,



2022. Call the 4-H Office for a list of activities that qualify.

Second, all 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade archery & shotgun participants must complete a Hunters Safety Course prior to shooting. If you need to take the course, go to www.georgiawildlife.com to see your

options for taking the course.

Archery Program: Our Archery Program is open to all 4<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade 4-H'ers. 4-H has both an Indoor & Outdoor State Competition. <u>Our Organizational Team Meeting will be on Oct.4th starting at 6:30pm at the 4-H Office</u>. Official indoor practices will start Tuesday, Oct. 19<sup>th</sup> (2 practices for new shooters only on 10/19 & 10/26). All shooters begin on Nov. 2<sup>nd</sup>. Official Outdoor practice will be held on Sunday

afternoons & optional Wednesday evenings starting in late January and will be held at the Cairo Recreational Department.

4-H'ers are encouraged to provide their own bow, but team bows are available if you need to borrow one.

You will have to provide your own arrows, quiver, and release.

Modified Trap: This program will begin in early February '22. 4-H'ers in grades 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> are eligible to participate. You will need to furnish your own gun; shells and skeet are included in the team registration fee.

Skeet, Trap, & Sporting Clays: This is our more advanced shotgun program.
4-H'ers in the 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grades are eligi-

## **HUNTER SAFETY CLASS REGISTRATION**

ne of the requirements for 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade 4-H'ers shooting on the Grady County 4-H Archery, Modified Trap or Skeet, Trap & Sporting Clays Teams is that you must complete the Georgia Hunter Safety Course.

Taking a Hunters Education Class in Georgia has been made easier than ever before. The course is offered three different ways. First, you can access the hunter education course online at www.georgiawildlife.com. Second, you can use a hunter education CD-ROM or finally, you can take a traditional classroom course.

After you pass your online Hunter Education Course, log onto your account at GoOutdoorsGeorgia and print your certificate. If you choose the CD-ROM route, you will need to complete the Customer Information Form and email or mail it in with a copy of your course completion certificate.

If you plan on shooting in 2022 and have not taken the Hunters Education Course, get signed up today to take the course either online or in person. After taking a quick look at the website, there are only a few in-person classes scheduled for the surrounding area. So, don't hesitate to sign up for a class before they fill up.

## **'22 COUNTY MARKET HOG SHOW**

The 2022 Grady County 4-H/FFA Market Hog Show is scheduled for Monday, January 17<sup>h</sup>. <u>The ownership</u> deadline for showing in the county show is

Wednesday, November 3, 2021.

4-H Age Rule: Anyone who is in the 3rd-12th grade is eligible to participate. Due to 4-H age requirement guidelines, there will be no Peewee Showmanship.

If you start looking for pigs around the first of October, they need to weigh around 60 lbs. or around 120 lbs. on November 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Our Homegrown division is now a County Grown division meaning any pigs purchased from a litter that was bred & born in Grady County is eligible to show in the County Grown Division.

There will not be an official weigh-in day this year, Mr. Deron , or FFA

Advisors Mrs. Harrison, Mr. Collins, or Mrs. Champagne will weigh & tag your pigs at your home by the Nov. 3<sup>rd</sup> entry deadline.

Don't forget the rule that all pigs must weigh a minimum of 210 lbs. to be eligible for the Ultra-Light Class. *The official show weight range is 220–280 pounds*.

## PROJECT ACHIEVEMENT (PA)

Project Achievement may just be the most beneficial program that 4-H has to offer and at the same time it may be the scariest.

Project Achievement is 4-H's public speaking program. When you participate in PA you will learn how to research a topic of your interest and how to organize a speech from your research. Then you will learn how to give your speech in front of an audience using proper speaking skills. You will also learn how to create posters and other supporting materials to aid in presenting your speech.

When selecting a topic to research, 4-H has over 60 different project areas you can choose from. Projects that range from Computers to Photography to Sports and Performing Arts. We offer

several Livestock related projects as well as other Companion Animal projects. You can even demonstrate how to cook a recipe that you love to eat.

Project Achievement is a little different for each of our three age divisions.

Cloverleaf: For our 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> graders, PA is only a 4 to 6 minute demonstration. This year, your competition will be held on November 13, 2021 in Tifton. We will start working on your demonstrations immediately.

Jr. & Sr.: For our 7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade 4-H'ers, PA is a combination of an 8 to 10 minute speech and a portfolio of all your 4-H and project related activities. For our 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> graders, your demonstration can last up to 12 minutes. You also have to complete a portfolio of all your 4-H

activities. The biggest difference between the Junior and Senior division is that Seniors are competing for a trip to State 4-H Congress and the chance to travel to National 4-H Congress.

If you are in the 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade and are interested in attending PA, you need to get started right away on your portfolio material. Your portfolios are due by December 17<sup>th</sup>. Competition is February 4-6, 2022 at Rock Eagle 4-H Center.

Awards: 4-H'ers who choose to compete in PA will be invited to our Annual 4-H Awards Ceremony for recognition.
