and respond well to the halter and show stick. Unruly calves will not be allowed to show.



e realize summer is still 4 months away, but **February is our Official** Camp Promotion Month! You will find information for all age groups included on this page.

Let us tell you to begin with that we will once again allow you to use the profits from your Vidalia Onion Sales in March -May to pay your camp registration fee. You will have to pay the non-refundable deposit out of your pocket and then you can use your onion profits to pay the remaining portion of your camp fee. For all of the camps, the deposit is \$75.

When you look at the camp registration deadlines, please keep in mind the sooner you pay your camp deposit the more likely you are to quarantee yourself a spot on the bus. We will continue to promote all 3 camps until they are full for the week we will be attending camp.

Senior Camp (a) Rock Eagle 4-4 Center

4-H'ers in grades 9-12 are eligible to attend Sr. Camp. This year, Senior Camp is headed to the Rock Eagle 4-H Center. Camp is scheduled for July 4-8 and will cost \$380. Senior 4-H'ers, this is your chance to socialize with other high school age 4-H'ers and not have those pesky cloverleaf or junior age 4-H'ers hanging around.

Plans will include 4th of July picnic with FIREWORKS, game room, and fun activities. There will be plenty of time to socialize with your friends from around the state. You will also enjoy the Rock Eagle Variety Show and Pageant.

There is only 1 statewide Senior Camp and registration is available on a first-come, first-serve basis for the entire state. So, if you are interested in attending Senior Camp, get your registration fee in early.

The camp fee can be broken down into 3 easy payments: March 4th - \$75 non-refundable deposit due, April 8th - \$150, and May 6th final payment of \$155. Mr. Deron will be serving as a leader for Senior Camp. We hope you will decide to join him for this fun and exciting week of camp!

Junior Camp @ Georgia 4-H at Camp Jekyll

て urf's up for Junior Camp 2022. This year, camp for 7th & 8th graders will be at Camp Jekyll the week of July 4-8. Jekyll Island is a Sea Island located just south of Brunswick, GA. Jekyll Island allows you to experience the wonders of Georgia's marshes and the beauty of its beaches.

Highlights of the week will include FIREWORKS on the beach, a dolphin boat tour, Tidelands Nature Center, putt putt, bicycle rental, Summer Waves Water Park, a special Buccaneer Ball Thursday evening, beach ecology, and swimming at the beach. You will certainly be kept busy during the week!

It is a week full of activities you will not want to miss. Registration is on a first-come, first-serve basis and our beginning camp

quota is 10 4-H'ers. The cost of camp is \$380. This covers all camping activities, lodging, meals, t-shirt, transportation cost and insurance. Camp payment can be broken down into three easy payments. These are as follows: March 4th -\$75 non-refundable deposit, April 8th - \$150 second payment, May 6th - \$155 final payment.

ow would you like to spend a week at a mountain getaway! This year, Cloverleaf Camp for 4th - 6th graders will be held at **Wahsega 4-H Center** the week of **June 13-17**. The **cost for the week of camp is \$330**. This covers all camp activities, camp t-shirt, transportation, insurance, lodging and camp meals. It can be broken down into 3 easy payments due as follows: March 4th - \$75 Non-Refundable Deposit, April 8th - \$125, and May 6th - \$130 Final Payment.

There is beauty in the woods and they call it Wahsega 4-H Center. Rustic but accommodating, campers enjoy a "hillbilly" theme in the midst of Appalachia, complete with waterfall and trout stream. There is time to go hiking or to be

challenged by the ropes course. There are classes in Mountain Hiking, with Wildlife Tracks & Signs, Forest Ecology & Herpetology (Snakes), Ultimate Frisbee, archery, Stream Ecology and the Low Ropes Challenge Course. You will also have a chance to dance to the hillbilly beat and wear your best hillbilly costume! When the sun sets and the moon is high, the fun continues with dances, a talent show, and mountain stories from the mountain man, Coon Lee.

Our beginning camp quota is 40 and sign up is on a first-come, first-serve basis. So if you are interested in attending Cloverleaf camp, you need to come by the 4-H Office and pay your camp deposit ASAP.
