- State Market Hog Show is Feb 19th-23rd



Breeding Heifer

- Looking for calves around March/April
- 4th-12th Grade can show at County/State
- County Cattle Show is Feb 15th @ 11 AM
- State Heifer Show is Feb 19th-22nd



Market Beef

- Three divisions: Prospect, Progress, & Market Heifer
- Prospect is ≤949 lbs. Progress is ≥950 lbs.
- 4th-12th Grade can show at County/State
- County Cattle Show is Feb 15th @ 11 AM
- State Market Beef Show is Feb 19th-23rd



Market Goat/Lamb

- Both Projects are State-Level Only
- Must be born between Jan-Apr
- 1st-12th Grade may be exhibitors
- Goats are usually Boer goat crosses
- Lambs usually are Suffolk-Hampshire crosses • State Lamb and Goat Show is Oct 3rd-6th



Breeding Doe

- State-Level Shows Only
- Must be owned and tagged in Dec of prior year to showing
- 1st-12th Grade may be exhibitors
- State Breeding Doe Show is Feb 20th-21st



Breeding Ewe

- State-Level Shows Only
- Must be owned and tagged in Dec of prior year to showing
- 1st-12th Grade may be exhibitors
- State Breeding Ewe Show is Feb 21st-22nd


