Active Middle School 4-H Members and 2025 Rewards Trip Requirements

Complete the five steps outlined below:

- 1) DPA: <u>https://georgia4h.org/programs/project-achievement/</u>**All project areas** need to be approved before work begins.
- Follow 2024- 2025 Gwinnett Meeting and Event Behavior Guidelines see page 3 These guidelines <u>will be enforced.</u>
- 3) Attend at least four monthly Council Meetings (ten opportunities).
- 4) Participate on one Judging Team (four are available see dates below).
- 5) Select any four other 4-H activities:
 - Work 4-H Farm Friends Educational Exhibit at the Gwinnett County Fair.
 - Participate in an additional Judging Team activity.
 - Attend a District Event or Conference (Junior Conference and Rally are options)
 - Participate in 4-H sponsored community service activity outside the Council.
 - Serve as a Leader providing a hands on craft or activity in the first 15 minutes of our new multilevel Council meeting now on Tuesday nights.
 - Serve as a local 4-H Middle School Grade Board Member. This is a four month commitment from either October—January or February—May. You must attend and serve at a minimum of three out of the four meetings to count for points.
 - Participate in Horse Club.
 - Recruit a new member to attend four or more council meetings and join 4-H.

Judging Teams coached by Barb Larson: Forestry, Consumer, and Poultry

Costs for registration and dinner at competitions are covered by our 4-H club. You must attend trainings and competition to receive a judging team credit. Judging teams have four/five practices and a Mock Competition before traveling to Area Competition during weekday afternoons. This does require <u>checking out early from</u> <u>school</u> in order to make the registration and start time.

Ms. Rachel Munro coaches a Wildlife Judging Team practice in April, with competition late April on a Saturday.

Gwinnett Meeting and Event Behavior Guidelines

These are the 4-H Gwinnett Meeting and Event Behavior Guidelines that you will be expected to follow.

Behavior <u>not accepted</u> at 4-H meetings and events:

- ***** Usage of curse words
- Discussions of inappropriate topics: if it is not appropriate to say in front of your grandparents, it is not appropriate for 4-H
- * Interruptions by talking throughout a meeting or event
- ***** Use of cell phones during a meeting or event
- ***** Breach of Code of Conduct rules

ULES

4-H'ers will receive a 'strike' for each behavioral issue according to the following policy:

- 4-H'ers may have no more than three strikes against them in order to attend the Rewards Trip.
- If a 4-H'er has more than three strikes, they will not be invited on the trip. If behavior strikes are issued during a rewards trip, parents will be called to pick up their child early from the trip.
- The strike system will run from the day after the Rewards Trip to the next year's Rewards Trip for Seniors (for example: August 1, 2024 approx. July 31, 2025).
- Strikes may be redeemed (see below).

To redeem behavior strikes, the 4-H'er must exhibit exemplary behavior in any of these areas:

- Sharing at a project club
- Helping at providing and leading activity or craft at Council
- Helping at with younger member level programing
- Assisting as a teen leader on a younger level field trip
- Helping as a teen leader at Cloverleaf DPA
- Office assistance to 4-H Staff (for preparation of events)
