

2024 GEORGIA 4-H HORSE SHOW AND **EDUCATIONAL CONTESTS**

Each year, Georgia 4-H hosts a statewide Horse Show that features everything from halter classes to dressage classes to timed contest events. Georgia 4-H also holds a number of horse-focused educational contests where 4-H'ers can showcase their talent in drawing, painting, method demonstration or public speaking, writing and photography.

Students who wish to show a horse or horses must own or lease a horse prior to March 1, 2024. Additionally, those students who wish to show a horse or horses must



complete an "Intent to Show Form" and complete specific Georgia 4-H Horseman books. Students who wish to participate in the Georgia 4-H Horse Show and Educational Contests must be 4th -12th graders currently enrolled in the Lamar County 4-H

Program. Eligibility is determined by grade level during the 2023- 2024 school year.

YOUNG SCHOLARS INTERNSHIP **PROGRAM JUNE-JULY 2024**

The University of Georgia College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (CAES) Summer Internship Programs target talented high school students who show a high aptitude in math and science related subjects.

The goal of the internship program is to encourage outstanding high school students to pursue careers in science. Students are paired with a mentor-scientist and each student will develop a science project to work on over the summer.

Selected summer interns work side-by-side with



CAES researchers for six weeks, and are paid a salary for up to 40 hours of work per week. The students earn money, learn job responsibility and, most importantly, are introduced to the work of agricultural scientists. The deadline for applications is January 31, 2024.
