- ◇ **1st** - Pick a topic. We suggest one of the many competition topics, there are lots of them! When you are selected to present, you will receive a rubric to help you get started with the categories to choose from and prepare your presentation.
- ◇ **2nd** - After you put together your poster, which will give you a visual to go with your speech, it is now practice time.
- ◇ **3rd** - Take your classroom presentation to the next level: **District Project Achievement- DPA for short.**
What is DPA? It is a public speaking competition held once a year by 4-H.

The Cloverleaf District Project Achievement will be held this school year on **January 26, 2019** in Rome. If you have not received a Friend's Book- Finding Your Way Through 4-H Project Achievement you will this month!

MILK MAKE CONTEST

Grades 4 – 6 (Cloverleaf) and Grades 7 – 8 (Junior):

- Each participant must submit a recipe for a milk-based drink including milkshakes and smoothies for the county contest.
- The main ingredient should be milk and the recipe should include the amount of ingredients, number of servings and directions for preparing the drink.
- Recipes can be written on the 4-H MilkMake Recipe Contest Recipe Card or on a separate piece of paper.
- Recipes will be judged on nutrition, appeal, creativity, recipe presentation, and recipe content.

Find or develop a recipe for your favorite milk drink. The main ingredient must be milk. This includes milkshakes and smoothies.
