How to do My 4-H Presentation

SPEECH

How long should my speech be? 5 minutes

I can speak about any topic in the Project Achievement Friends Book except **NO** <u>Food and NO</u> <u>Celebrities</u>
How do I pick a topic? <u>Current Interest</u> or <u>School Project</u>

The 3 parts of a speech are Introduction, Body, Conclusion

The Introduction (the first part of the speech) should be about 30 seconds long.

My Introduction needs to **include** <u>an interesting fact, my first & last name and the name of my topic.</u>

The body (the second part of the speech) should be about 4 minutes long.

The body of my speech needs to contain 3 to 5 parts. The parts are subtopics of my broad topic.

The conclusion (the third part of the speech) should be about 30 seconds long.

In the conclusion of the speech I need to <u>restate the parts of my speech</u> & <u>Say my closing statement</u>
I WILL NOT end my speech with <u>that's it/all, I'm done, Ok, thank you, asking for any questions,</u> or by just walking away.

POSTERS

For the 4-H demonstration I have to use posters only, **no** <u>tri boards</u>

All of my posters have to be full size and they should all **stand the in the same direction (all horizontal or all vertical**)

I have to have a <u>title</u> poster (like the cover of a book) and <u>all words (72pt font or 2inches is a good size)</u> & <u>pictures</u> must be large enough to be seen from the <u>back</u> of the room.

I should transport my posters in a **trash bag** & I should **not** roll them.

TIPS FOR SUCCESS

I should **practice** my speech **out loud** as much as possible. I will not forget my speech on the day I am giving it **because** I will write it on **note cards** to help me remember it, NOT notebook paper. I will **face the audience**, **be pleasant** & **speak up**

I will number my notecards to make it easier to use them in case I need a hint during my speech

While giving my speech I will look at my audience because I will **practice** enough to feel comfortable with saying it and **not reading** it to my audience.
