4-H Project !!!

The 4-H Project is 2 Parts:

#1 Part: 2-3 Page Report

#2 Part: Create a Poster / Tri-board

(Poster are complete at home)

Supplies Needed:

- *Poster Board- Tri-Board or Single Poster
- *Glue / Rubber Cement
- *Construction Paper for accent
- *Colorful Pictures
- *Google Slides: 3 or 4 Points that you discuss in your 4-H paper & printed out

4-H PROJECT JUDGING CRITERIA

Report:

- 2-3 Pages Typed or Neatly Hand Written (front side only of paper)
- Report should have 3 parts: Introduction, Body (3 points), & Conclusion
- "How to Projects": List all necessary steps involved
(Ex. How to build a model car, How to make a shoot archery)
- *Include important facts, statistics, etc. in your paper

Poster:

- You may use a single poster board or a tri-board
- NEATNESS-wording needs to be legible
- **Use of color (No more than 2-3 colors)**
- Wording on poster can be computer printed or handwritten
- Pictures are a plus! Colored or black & white pictures, drawings graphs, charts, etc.)

JUDGES: THE STEPHENS COUNTY RETIRED EDUCATORS

This is a 5th grade 4-H project competition where the students 4-H projects (2-3 page report & poster) are judged for 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place in their specific project area.

Last November, each student individually made a 4-H Project Layout. They chose an area of interest, and 3 points to research on the chosen topic. Then, we brainstormed where they could find their information– research on their chosen interest. The students wrote their 4-H paper in class in December.

Today, we talked about visual communication– posters. What makes an effective poster, about use of color, pictures, etc. The poster the students create will go along with their chosen topic / interest. They may design and create a tri-board (3 sided board) or a single poster.

All 1st place 4-H Project Fair winners are invited to attend the district competition, which is called - **District Project Achievement, on Saturday, March 25,** at South Jackson Elem.School.

What is 4-H District Project Achievement? 4-H Project Achievement is a cornerstone in the Georgia 4-H Program. Project Achievement serves to showcase 4-H'ers work and success in each 4-H project area. The students will compete for district honors against other 5th grade 4-H'ers in our district area. This is a **FREE 4-H event** provide through funding received from the Stephens County 4-H program. Parents are invited to attend, but not mandatory. Information regarding District Project Achievement will be sent home after the 4-H Project competition in February.

In preparation for 4-H Cloverleaf Project Achievement the 1st place winners can attend an after school District Project Achievement preparation and practice class, 3:00-5:00 pm, at school. **I will send home the date of the practices.** After which, there will be a parent meeting from 5:00-6:00 pm. At this practice is where 4-H'ers take their 4-H projects and turn it into an oral presentation. We use their 4-H project 2-3 page report and make it their speech. They learn tips on public speaking, and practice giving their presentations. Students have the opportunity to learn and develop skills in public speaking.
